## **Administrative Board Meeting Minutes**

May 2021

he Administrative Board met via Zoom video conference on Wed., May 12th at 6:00 pm. Bill & Theresa Berriman, Carol Kimberley, Lowell Halfhill, Bob & Marilyn Matthews, Jolene Brady, Chairman Bob & Barbara Leonard, and Pastor Phil were present.

Pastor Phil opened the meeting with prayer. Bill moved to accept last month's secretarial report as printed in the church newsletter. Seconded by Marilyn. Motion passed.

Treasurer Theresa presented the financial report for approval. Deposits totaled \$xxxx.xx. Debits totaled \$xxxx.xx. The balance on the checkbook statement was \$xxxxx.xx as of April 30th. All accounts balanced. It was noted that the name "GIG" on line #1206 of the report is the name of the booking agent for the Block Party entertainment. Also to mention, the blinds purchased for the parsonage included blinds for the whole house, plus the installation. These types of purchases will be kept separate from rent records in the future. Motion to approve the financial report was seconded by Lowell. Approval given.

Bill & Theresa reported that the fluorescent bulbs and ballasts have been cleared out of the church and were properly discarded at the Metro Waste Authority in Bondurant. There were disposal fees for this service.

Bill reported that the Block Party on Aug 7th may need to be moved back to the church location, rather than the Middle School because one of the walls was damaged during the demolition and may not be fixed in time. More information will be coming soon.

The church parking lot will be closed this coming Sunday (May 16th) since the concrete needs to cure and the second installation is scheduled to take place this Friday. Jolene will send out a notice to the congregation that parking will be available on the street and the far west side of the lot. Handicapped spots will still be available.

Carol K. noted that the graduation gifts have been purchased and reception plans have been made for June 6th, which will be Youth Sunday and graduation recognition day. Since Youth Sunday is planned for that first Sunday in June, Communion will move to the following Sunday, June 13th.

Jolene reminded us that the newsletter deadline is Thursday, May 20th.

Pastor Phil shared his report. Our Memorial Day service will be Sunday, May 30th and Bill has a video link he will share to use during the service. Pastor will be taking part in the Memorial Day service at 9:00 am on Monday, May 31st at the Ashton Chapel. Father's Day Sunday will be June 20th.

Bill reported that major tree trimming was done today at the church, including tree removal along the side of the creek since the church owns that property. MidAmerican Energy disconnected the power to the church. The power had not yet been restored, but should be soon. A church clean-up day will also be needed soon. The shed will need to be cleaned out, along with brush and limbs. Rodney's excavator will be helpful. Tawnya will make a list of inside projects that need to be done. A date will be set soon.

Bill also mentioned that the Alumni Association has asked to borrow the large tent for their reunion this year, which will take place the first Saturday in June. It was agreed that they may use the tent, with the understanding that it must be taken down right afterwards. Rodney is familiar with the tent, so he should be able to help.

Several concerns were addressed regarding the future of the church and what might be done in order to become a "community church" by reaching out to more individuals or especially families with younger children within town. In order to grow the church, we need to begin by growing relationships with those within the community. The Block Party might be a good focus to make quality connections with more families and children and find out what their needs might be. Then we might be able to fill that need for them, whether that be through engaging programs or other activities geared towards the younger generation. Pastor Phil would like to meet with others who would be motivated to help with this.

As previously discussed, the May monthly Local Mission Giving donation of \$100.00 will be used to mail another box of supplies to Uganda. The June monthly donation will go to the Jasper County Habitat for Humanity and the July donation will be sent to Hawthorn Hill.

Bob M. moved that the meeting be adjourned, seconded by Bill. All prayed "The Lord's Prayer" together in closing.

#### SEND A WARM MESSAGE OF LOVE -

In December of last year (2020), Jolene, Saralee and I heard news that rocked us. Our dear friend from Uganda, Pastor Perezi Were, had passed away unexpectedly. Through a postmortem, Florence told us that the doctors had discovered an undetected heart problem and Perezi had passed away from a blood clot in his lung. Perezi and Florence were in their early 40s when Saralee and I traveled to Uganda. So this would put him at his late 40s.

Because they live in Uganda, Perezi's death left Florence in a much more difficult life situation. All things are put into the man's name — the church, the school, the property, etc. It took her almost 5 months to get a death certificate in order to be able to carry on with Perezi's legacy. Even though they were married for over 20 years, Perezi's death notice had to be made public for a month so that anyone who believed they had a claim to his property could be notified. How different this is from us in the States! Business matters are still being settled but it is with great joy that Florence has the support of her congregation and school to continue on.

When I heard of this sadness, I decided to crochet a "prayer shawl" in patriotic colors to send to Florence to let her know of the people here in America who love and care for her, the family, the church, and the school. Every time I worked on the shawl, prayers were said for her.

The shawl is now completed and I would like to send it to Florence. But I would like to add warm messages of love to the Ugandan family from our church family. If you would like to write a card (and maybe include a picture of your family), I will be preparing the box for her to mail by the end of June. You can drop cards off at church or get them to Jeri by June 25th (the last Sunday in June). I will also have blank cards available if you need one.

Thank you for your prayers and sharing your love with someone half-way across the world.
