ogether in February, we are laying the groundwork for the year ahead as we focus on the basics of Christ's ministry and His model to guide us as a church and personally!

B: Begin with prayer - Jesus began His ministry on a mountain praying - Sunday, February 6th


Listen - Jesus asked more questions than He answered (loving gift) - Sunday, February 13th

Administrative Board Meeting Minutes

January 2022

he Administrative Board met via Zoom video conference on Wed., Jan. 12th at 6:00 pm. Rodney Altes, Bill & Theresa Berriman, Janice Gregerson, Lowell Halfhill, Carol Kimberley, Julie Warner, Kent & Dawn McKee, Marilyn Matthews, Jeri Heffelfinger, Jolene Brady, Chairman Bob & Barbara Leonard, and Pastor Phil were present.

Pastor Phil opened the meeting with prayer. Janice moved to accept last month's secretarial report as printed in the newsletter. Seconded by Theresa. Motion passed. Treasurer Theresa presented the financial report for approval. Deposits totaled \$#,###.##. Debits totaled \$#,###.## as of December 31st. All accounts balanced. It was noted that we received a rebate on the AC and furnace. Motion to approve the financial report was seconded by Carol. Approval given.

The church has received a thank you note from the Adopt-a-Family program.

Duct cleaning for the church parsonage is scheduled for next week. The quote was approx \$545.

The February Movie and Meal will be scheduled after the January movie.

The church newsletter deadline will be next Thurs., Jan. 20th. Jolene is creating an abbreviated brochure-type of newsletter for the Seasons of Love gift bags. It will feature Pastor's Note on the front with the calendar and info box including all of the service information and links on the back. Please let Jolene know by the deadline if you have any additional items for the February calendar or newsletter. Jolene also noted that she has prepared and given the 2021 year-end information to Jan Borts and sent the Missions reports to Marilyn. Marilyn will be working on preparing the Missions report soon.

The last Sunday to collect donations for our special "Love" Gift for our Uganda sister church and school was last Sunday. Berriman's will cover the \$50 international wire transfer fee. The Brady family will add their donation in memory of Trenton. Jolene and Theresa will finalize details on Sunday and Jolene will get the transfer set up through the bank.

Rodney, Bill, & Theresa met with Theresa & Ryan Maher who will be reopening an area restaurant and might be interested in purchasing the oven/stove in the church kitchen if it will fit in their kitchen area. The large range was used primarily for Turkey Suppers and is no longer needed. We do not keep the pilot lights lit at all times, but that should not be an issue in a restaurant setting. Bill checked with distributors and liquidators and the unit is worth between approx. \$1,500 - \$1,800 retail value. Bill also checked price offers with wholesalers in Waterloo and Des Moines, and he is to meet with the Maher's again tomorrow afternoon. Bill made the motion to offer the current church range unit to the Maher's (contingent upon it fitting in their kitchen) for \$825 if they will move it. Seconded by Marilyn. Motion passed. If the Maher's do agree to purchase it, they will not be able to move it until this summer. The church will find a more user-friendly and non-commercial range to replace it. It was suggested that a few people get together and find what might be available and compare costs and features to find the best choice as a replacement.

In December, Tawnya Vry visited with Theresa about the church janitor position and since she has been back to work full-time and has increased responsibilities, she has requested to pass the duties onto someone else. Lori Pease has agreed to fill the position. In order to avoid a gap in cleaning, Bill called several Board members and all agreed that the Pease family could step in. Theresa made the motion to accept Tawnya Vry's resignation as church janitor and accept Lori Pease as her replacement. Seconded by Lowell. Motion passed.

Theresa noted that she has presented cards and gift certificates from the Board to two retirees that we needed to properly congratulate but had not previously done so.

Bill also shared that the Winter-Related Closing Plan seemed to work very well and was quickly put into place when needed. He also mentioned that he and Rodney have mounted a large screen downstairs in Fellowship Hall that will make movies easier to see and hear. There is also plenty of time before the summer, but we should be thinking about having a garden giveaway at the church on some weekend(s) during June/July/August. The kid games could be paired with the event as well, so we can be getting some ideas together about that.

Marilyn gave an update on Trisha Hobbs, and noted that she really needs our prayers once again. Her cancer has metastasized and is terminal. She has entered into a trial research study using the highest dose possible. She will be making frequent trips to Iowa City. Jolene will print her most recent update in the church newsletter. Marilyn will check with her to get a current home address, since they moved out to the country between Newton and Mingo. We will not be formally organizing a meal schedule this time, but any church member can help however they feel led. Besides prayers and words of encouragement, meals, gas or gift cards, and cash donations would all be a huge help to Trisha and her family right now.

Pastor gave his report and outlined the focus topics for each Sunday through Easter. On January 23rd, in-person and online studies will begin for the book, "B.L.E.S.S. It will be the focus of the Sunday morning worship services, as well as a 4:00 pm book study. The next Sundays will follow along with the book chapters, and an additional Sunday with Communion on Feb. 20th. Then Pastor's message will move to a "Love Your Neighbor" theme. Women at the Well will have a special guest speaker for us on Sunday, Mar. 27th. In March and April, Pastor will ask for persons to share their story either verbally, or in a written form for him to share. This will lead us up to April 10th, which is Holy Week and Easter on April 17th, which is later on the calendar this year. Pastor will urge us to invite others to attend Easter services.

Jeri reminded us that the "Season of Love" Soup Supper is scheduled for Sat., Feb. 19th. Along with the gift bag "newsletter brochures," Jolene has also created the mailers and flyers to be mailed to the 50168 zip code. Some extras can be printed to send to folks with other zip codes in the surrounding areas. Theresa will deliver flyers to the businesses around Mingo as well. Apples and oranges, as well as attendance gifts have been ordered. Caleb and the Brady boys will help with water bottles and filling the bags. Theresa and Janet A. will oversee the soup. Dawn & Barbara will take photos at the event. Decorations, tablecloths and balloons have been organized but will need help to set up before the event. Rodney, Bill, Theresa, and Steve Ayers took down the nativity set on the church lawn, but left the posts up with a cross-piece for the Soup Supper banner. So overall, we seem to be in good shape.

As previously discussed, the January monthly Local Mission Giving donation of \$100.00 was sent to the Goodman Youth Group. February's donation will be sent to Colfax-Mingo Post Prom, and March's donation will go to Bidwell Riverside.

Janice G. moved that the meeting be adjourned, seconded by Bill. All prayed "The Lord's Prayer" together in closing.

Update from Trisha Hobbs:

January 5, 2022

After a very, very long day and early morning, 5 or 6 vials of blood, an EKG, urinalysis, a cat scan and 'round and 'round the hospital, I am happy to say I will take my first clinical trial meds at 8 pm tonight.

It did not take long to quickly remind me of how long and heavy these days are for me and what the future is going to entail. This trial does not have a time limit and I can stay on it as long as it's working and I do not become too sick. They started me on the highest dose possible and we can adjust if needed.

I have had many people ask how they can help and while it's never easy I have come to that moment and sometimes it's necessary.

This time there has been no time to prepare not knowing if the trial would accept me.

I would not have been able to do the last year-long clinical trial without all the benefits and help. God definitely had a hand in it. I had just enough money clear down to the very last trip! If it was a straight shot, I drove as many miles as it takes to go from here to Africa! Insane, but life-changing for me. Each time, it has opened a new door and eligibility to move to the next treatment.

Unfortunately, these meds do not come without side effects and I still have to be a mom, wife, house cleaner, chauffer, laundry doing, cancer fighting mama! My life can and does not stop because of cancer.

Here are some things that would tremendously help my family:

- **Meals-** Frozen or fresh meals to use on long lowa City days after I return home as I will be making frequent trips again and on days that I'm not feeling well.
- Gift cards to restaurants to quickly pick up or have meals delivered.
- Gas cards
- Fresh vegetables/ fruit/ healthy snacks to keep my nutrition up.
- Games, puzzles, activities, movie passes, dvd movies for the kids. It's never easy to have to watch a parent go through cancer, not feel well, or be able to do normal activities.
