### Are You Ready to be a B.L.E.S.S.ing Every Day?

elcome to March and to our *Mission Critical* as we learn and begin to implement the 5 everyday ways to love our neighbor, change our community, and the world.

For the past two months, we have been discovering, learning and implementing the 5 Everyday B.L.E.S.S. practices. We have been discovering that these practices are grounded in the Old Testament but lived out by Jesus. They are:

- **Begin with Prayer -** We've identified over 500 persons that they are praying for 3 times daily.
- **Listen** The importance of listening with our hearts. Listening like Jesus.
- **Eat** Learning the importance of eating that moves us into deeper relationship for sharing
- **S: Serve** Serving together in our community alongside others to build relationships
- **Story** Each identifying our story of when God was most real and do storytelling.

Now we're focusing on loving our neighbor, our family, friends and those with whom we work. Our goal, like Jesus, is to learn to live in relationship with one another. Like the words of Saint Francis of Assisi – *preach the gospel at all times, and if necessary use words* captures our imagination. Together, we are learning to be a spiritual influence in our neighborhood and in our community.

- We are learning to love our neighbor the way Jesus did.
- We are working on avoiding ways to make the Good News complicated when it should simply come from the heart.
- We want to learn to move beyond relationally-awkward conversations, because the gospel was meant to be shared in our routine exchanges between friends and neighbors.
- We want to put into practice the five simple ways that can bless people within the rhythm of their every day lives!
- We want to make sure that we understand what God's responsibility is and what our responsibility is.
- We are learning and then implementing what God has asked us to do. This is not a program, it is our "Lifestyle for Daily Living."
- We believe in faith that the people we are loving and living around us will come to know the love of God and follow Jesus because we have been a blessing to them. It's that simple.

Let's come, all together, throughout the month of March as we head towards Easter to see the "Fruit of our Blessing." Each Sunday, we will be sharing together and hearing as people share their faith stories and discoveries in blessing one another. We will also be launching some "B.L.E.S.S. Small Groups" where we can voluntarily share our "Blessings Ministry" and how we are blessed in return. These small groups can provide us an opportunity to strengthen one another by holding ourselves accountable and share the results that we have seen in the lives of the persons we are praying for daily.

Join us any Sunday and join us in being blessed so we can be a blessing. We're putting to the test what is the mission of Jesus – it's simply unstoppable when Christ-followers recognize the opportunities around us and the responsibility to help people experience the love of Jesus. God is with us! **Go Be the Church!**

## **Administrative Board Meeting Minutes**

February 2022

he Administrative Board met via Zoom video conference on Wed., Feb. 9th at 6:00 pm. Rodney Altes, Bill & Theresa Berriman, Janice Gregerson, Carol Kimberley, Kent & Dawn McKee, Jeri Heffelfinger, Jolene Brady, Chairman Bob & Barbara Leonard, and Pastor Phil were present.

Pastor Phil opened the meeting with prayer. Janice moved to accept last month's secretarial report as printed in the newsletter. Seconded by Bill. Motion passed.

Treasurer Theresa presented the financial report for approval. Deposits totaled \$x,xxx.xx. Debits totaled \$x,xxx.xx. The balance on the checkbook statement was \$xx,xxx.xx as of January 31st. All accounts balanced. Motion to approve the financial report was seconded by Carol. Approval given.

Theresa reported that duct cleaning for the church parsonage was completed last week for \$545 and the bill has been paid. Additionally, the old stove in the church kitchen has been sold and the new replacement range will be delivered Feb. 22nd. The new stove/range will be kept in the nursery until the old one can be removed.

Bill noted that he has visited with Hometown Pride and the contact for the Food Pantry at the Mingo Library about the idea for a summertime garden giveaway. It would work well to hold the event at the Mingo Community Center shelter on Saturday mornings from 9 am - 12-noon. Surplus produce (fruit & vegetables), potted plants, and cut flowers could be made available.

The church has received several thank you notes, including those from Jeri Heffelfinger, Tawnya Vry, Goodman's Youth Group, and Hope Ministries. The notes are posted on the bulletin board at church.

The March Movie and Meal will be Wed., Mar. 16th at 12-noon and the movie will be "Risen." More information will be posted and sent out.

The church newsletter deadline will be Sun., Feb. 20th.

Jolene reported that our special "Love" Gift for our Uganda sister church and school was sent to Florence on Jan. 19th. The church congregation's generous donations totaled an amazing \$1,600.00. Florence emailed a heartfelt thank you message that Jolene will place in the next church newsletter. Florence mentioned that the schools had been shut down due to the pandemic for such a long time and finally reopened on Jan. 10th, but they found that much of their furniture and portions of their school had been damaged by termites and adverse weather conditions during the closure. So our Love Gift came at just the perfect timing and means so much to them as they work to repair and replace damaged items.

Pastor gave his report and outlined the remaining topics for each Sunday through Easter with his message focusing on the "B.L.E.S.S." book and "Love Your Neighbor" theme. "Love One Another" yard signs will be available to purchase for \$15 each for those who would like to place a sign in their yards and make a special connection with the community. An Ash Wednesday service will be held in-person at the Mingo UMC at 6:00 pm on Wed., Mar. 2nd. Farrar & Colfax UMCs are invited to join us. YouTube live will be available as well. Women at the Well will have a special guest speaker for us on Sunday, Mar. 27th. In March and April, Pastor will ask for persons to share their story either verbally, or in a written form for him to share. Looking ahead, April 10th is the beginning of Holy Week and Easter on April 17th.

Jeri shared her "Bless Mingo" story that she posted on Facebook. Some time ago, she had donated unfinished hand-embroidered quilt blocks that her grandmother had made. As Jeri was visiting Many Hands Thrift Shop, she saw a beautiful quilt created from the very blocks that she had previously donated. She told them that if the quilt was ever for sale, she would purchase it. In a wonderful show of love and generosity, the shop gifted Jeri the special quilt.

Jeri also reminded us that the "Season of Love" Soup Supper is scheduled for Sat., Feb. 19th. The event will be fairly informal and everyone is invited to come help make the evening a success.

The February monthly Local Mission Giving donation of \$100.00 was to go to Colfax-Mingo Post Prom, but Theresa has not heard back from them yet. As previously discussed, March's donation will go to Bidwell Riverside.

Bill moved that the meeting be adjourned, seconded by Janice. All prayed "The Lord's Prayer" together in closing.
