John 13:34-35 TLB says, "And so I am giving a new commandment to you now—love each other just as much as I love you. Your strong love for each other will prove to the world that you are my disciples."

Pastor opened by leading the group with prayer.

Bob Leonard asked for acceptance of the December minutes that were submitted by Nicki. This approved by Janice and seconded by Bill. Theresa submitted the treasures report and all accounts balanced. All present were in favor of the treasure report.

Bob brought up issues with the sewage back up and it is in front of the church. Christ Hook is doing the work and because of the cost cutting measures that were taken in the past, it is costing more now. Some of back up wen into the church's rental property.

Theresa advised the funds need to be placed into the church account as the school account is now gone. Checks have been made out to Jolene or giving her cash. Jolene advised she will provide the account numbers to set it up to have the funds sent to Florence.

Marilyn brought up that some of the people are not getting mailers of the Newsletter. I (Nicki) advised to forward the email address and they would get them added to the list, as they were being sent to everyone on the list that was provided and I want to make sure that I was not leaving anyone off.

Jeri brought up as Christmas gifts she likes to make sequence calendars and has given one to the church. It is hanging by the south doors in memory of her dear friend Roseanne who passed away. Janice submitted motion to adjourn this was second by Bill and approved by all in attendance. Pastor led the group in closing with the lord's prayer.

2023 Midwest Mission Distribution Disaster Health Kits

The Mingo Methodist Church has started collecting items for MMDC Health Kits in January 2023. Each month you may contribute an item that has been designated for that month. The items will be assembled into kits in October to be delivered to the Greenfield Ingathering site the first Saturday in November. Each kit is valued at \$12 per kit.

All items included in the kits must be new items and cardboard needs to be removed from combs or nail files/clippers only.

January - 1 Hand towel (15" x 25l" up to 17" x 27" NO Kitchen towels)

February - 1 wash cloth

March - 1 comb (Large and sturdy, NO pocket size, rattail combs w/o handles acceptable)

April - 1 nail file or fingernail clippers (NO emery boards or toenail clippers)

May - 1 bath-size bar of soap (3oz and up – DO NOT remove paper)

June - 1 toothbrush (single brushes only in original wrapper, NO child-size brushes)

July - 6 adhesive plastic strip sterile band aids (3/4" to 1" sizes)


